Director of paratransit and specialized services for the (RTC) Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada

Director of Paratransit and Specialized Services Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada. Antonette Braddock joined the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC) in June2013. In her role as Director of Paratransit and Specialized Services, she leads a diverse range of agency departments with a combined budget of nearly\$60 million annually, including Paratransit and Specialized Services, Certification, Customer Care, and Mobility Training.

Antonette has developed specialized programs to service Southern Nevada's most venerable residents including paratransit, seniors, and veterans. Most notable is the project development and management of both the RTC Paratransit Ride on-Demand, which launched in 2017, and the RTC Microtransit project OnDemand, which launched in 2021.

Antonetteis the current President of WTS Nevada and serves on the WTS Foundation's Scholarship Committee. She is also on the board of Blind connect, an organization that provides life skills and employment training and has peer support programs for Nevadans affected by vision loss.

She has resided in Southern Nevada since 2003 with her husband and young daughter.



Stroke has a new indicator

They say if you email this to ten people, you stand a chance of saving one life.

**Blood Clots/Stroke** – They Now Have a Fourth Indicator, the Tongue **STROKE**: Remember the 1st Three Letters.... S.T. R.

During a BBQ, a woman stumbled and took a little fall - she assured everyone that she was fine (they offered to call paramedics) she said she had just tripped over a brick because of her new shoes. They got her cleaned up and got her a new plate of food. While she appeared a bit shaken up, Jane went about enjoying herself the rest of the evening. Jane's husband called later telling everyone that his wife had been taken to the hospital - (at 6:00 PM Jane passed away) She had suffered a stroke at the BBQ. Had they known how to identify the signs of a stroke, perhaps Jane would be with us today. Some don't die. They end up in a helpless, hopeless condition instead.

## STROKE IDENTIFICATION:

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours, he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough.

### RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

## Remember the '3' steps, STR.

Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

S \*Ask the individual to SMILE.

T \*Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently) (i.e., Chicken Soup)

R\*Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call emergency number immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

## **New Sign of a Stroke**

Stick out Your Tongue!

NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: Ask the person to 'stick' out his tongue. If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other that is also an indication of a stroke.
